Hive Chat

Key concerns for your apiary this month:

- The flow has ended, bees may be stressed and cranky. Check food stores and feed if light. Weak hives may be prone to robbing install robbing screens as needed.
- Varroa levels will be ramping up, do your mite checks and treat if above threshold.

Presentation: "VarroxSan" a new mite treatment by Vita Bee Health

David Westerfelt is the new consultant for Vita Bee Health North America. He is the retired Chief Apiarist for the State of Florida. Today he discussed various mite treatment options and introduced us to a new oxalic acid-based treatment/delivery system that will be approved in the US later this month.

VarroxSan is an oxalic acid-based treatment, delivered to the colony via a sustained-release fiberboard strip placed within the brood nest.
