Meeting Minutes March 13, 2025

The OCBA March 2025 members meeting was attended by approximately 46 members in-person at the Orange County Extension Office in Hillsborough.

Presentation: Quality Queens From Your Backyard

Ashby Miller is the owner of Ashby Farms in Burlington, NC. He runs ~500 colonies in about 16 different apiary locations. Ashby presented strategies for propagating varroa mite-resistant stock he uses in his business that can be adapted to backyard apiaries.

OCBA Member Survey Results

Prior to the invited speaker talk, Axel Elling, President, presented the results from the OCBA member survey that was sent out earlier in the year. He explained the purpose of the survey was to gain feedback that will help shape policy, decisions, and programming for the OCBA.

- Some key takeaways:
 - Our membership is primarily made up of members with less than 1 year (36% of respondents) or greater than 7 years (25%).
 - o A majority (75%) reported they attend monthly meetings, and 37% have participated in a collaborative or cluster.
 - o Survey results confirm there is an interest in an Intermediate beekeeping course.
 - The 3 top reasons why members have quit beekeeping and/or did not renew their membership: 1) colony collapse/loss of bees, 2) expense, 3) physical demands/health reasons.
 - One of the biggest challenges for OCBA is getting members to volunteer for events, committees, and board positions. 64% of survey respondents indicated no interest in volunteering for our club!
- Some points brought up by members regarding difficulty securing volunteers for committees and volunteering for events:
 - It was noted that calling something a formal "Committee" is a turn-off. It would be better
 to be more specific because often, these needs for volunteers are not a large time/effort
 commitment.
 - O Another member noted that lack of volunteers is a common theme in the multiple bee clubs he is a member of, so this is not a problem unique to OCBA.
 - O Another point was made to highlight opportunities for members who are new to beekeeping to contribute. Most (if not all) volunteer opportunities do not require having passed the certified exam. In fact, anyone who attends these meetings likely has far more knowledge than the general public about bees, beekeeping, and other relevant topics.

Clarity on this could encourage our newer beekeepers to feel confident enough to volunteer.

- Bee School 2025
 - O Carrie reported that Bee School 2025 has just finished. In all, there were 72 students, which brought in \$2675 in club revenue.
